<p>COMPETITIVE SEASON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Competitive season begins January 1.</li> <li>Regular competitive season traditionally finishes around mid to late March.</li> <li>All decisions for an upcoming competitive season are finalized at the preceding <b>Fall</b> NCWGA General Meeting.</li> <li>Follow the <u>NCWGA Membership Packet</u> for member requirements and procedures.</li> </ul>
<p>HOSTING A MEET</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All meets must follow USA Gymnastics Rules and Policies.</li> <li>For local meets, consult the <u>NCWGA Meet Scheduling Procedure</u></li> <li>For State Championships, see the <u>NCWGA Level 7-10 State Championships Packet</u></li> </ul>
<p>QUALIFICATION TO STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS</p> <p><i>Qualification Reporting Deadline: March 12</i></p> <p><i>Final Qualification Date: March 18</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Gymnasts may qualify to State Championships from a local meet held in Region I, with a 32.00 minimum All Around score.</li> <li>Coaches must report any gymnast who is qualified to Level Nine State Championships reported to their respective Zone Representatives by <b>Monday, March 12</b>.</li> <li>Any gymnast who has not yet qualified may still compete and qualify on the final qualifying weekend <b>March 19-20</b>. Coaches must be report these qualified gymnasts to Zone Representatives, and register with the State Championship Host by <b>Monday, March 19</b>.</li> <li>For petition procedures, refer to current <u>USA Gymnastics Rules and Policies</u>.</li> <li>There is a \$25 per gymnast late fee assessed to clubs for reporting late to Zone Representatives and late entry to Level Nine State Championships.</li> </ul>
<p>NORCAL LEVEL NINE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS</p> <p><i>March 23-25</i></p> <p><i>Hosted by Champion Gymnastics</i></p> <p><i>Stockton Civic Auditorium</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Age groups for Level Nine State Championships will be split into divisions ranging youngest to oldest, subject to adjustment. These age groups may or may not follow the age groups determined by USA Gymnastics for Regional and Western Championships.</li> <li>Team competition is determined at the completion of the entire meet, by a team's top three or four All Around gymnasts, regardless of age division, with the top three scores per event counting.</li> </ul>
<p>USA GYMNASTICS REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS</p> <p><i>April 13-15</i></p> <p><i>Hosted by Brown's Gymnastics Las Vegas, NV</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Qualifying score is a 34.00 minimum All Around score at Level Nine State Championships.</li> <li>For petition procedures, refer to current <u>USA Gymnastics Rules and Policies</u>.</li> </ul>
<p>USA GYMNASTICS WESTERN CHAMPIONSHIPS</p> <p><i>May 3-6</i></p> <p><i>Boise, Idaho</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The top 12 All Around athletes in each of the 8 age divisions from each of the four regions will compete as Regional Team members, provided they scored a minimum of 34.00 AA at the Regional Championships</li> <li>Any gymnast who ties for 12<sup>th</sup> place AA will attend the Western Championships and will be outfitted as the other competitors. The tie-breaking procedures will be used to determine which gymnast's scores will count for Regional Team score, and which will compete as an individual. All Western qualifiers may count for Team Score.</li> <li>See the <u>USA Gymnastics Rules and Policies</u> for more details</li> </ul>
